WSGP DID YOU KNOW EDUCATIONAL SERIES

PART 1

Chronology of events leading to non-profit status:

- 1. April, 2005. Seminar with Cesar Millan, "The Dog Whisperer." This was Cesar's first seminar outside of California and no protocol was established other than the proceeds went to something related to dogs—preferably, rescue. Clearly, the White Shepherd Genetics Project would be honored to host him and earn the proceeds. This first seminar gave us the real start of a Genetics Fund with approximately \$7,000.00. At that time, Cesar's staff had no requirement that the organization be non-profit.
- 2. August 2006. Second seminar with Cesar Millan in Michigan. This time, we were informed that we had to supply our tax ID number before we could receive a check. This was a much larger amount of money, closer to \$19,000.
- 3. August 22, 2006. Filed Articles of Incorporation for use by domestic nonprofit corporations and obtained our LLC status and our tax ID number to give to Cesar's staff.

Purpose for which we were organized:

i. To preserve, protect, and improve the health of the White Shepherd/white German Shepherd dog by educating breeders, pet owners, and the general public by conducting and supporting research, and organizing fundraisers through seminars, raffles, auctions, and donations.

- 1. October 24, 2006. Met for two hours with our personal attorney to organize the information and paperwork to get the non-profit status going. Contracted with The Foundation Group to handle this application for us since it was clear to me I wasn't going to find the 80 or so hours necessary to wade through and meet all the requirements.
- The Foundation Group states: "For 12 years running, The Foundation Group has maintained a *100% IRS approval rate*. We've prepared literally thousands of 501c3 applications, all of which have been granted tax-exempt status by the Internal Revenue Service. We accomplish this by actually getting to know your organization and accurately representing its programs.
- You will be approved we *guarantee* it! "
- If we don't get approved, we get a full refund.
- Found out that 2/3 of the Board has to be from the states so with Joanne in Canada and Ruut in Holland, our initial plan to get started with the three of us wouldn't work. There were other requirements I had to look into and again I felt stalled.
- I purchased a book called *Starting & Building a Nonprofit—A Practical *Guide* and started reading and researching.
- 2. February 2008. A few fundraising discussions were started and it became evident that Ken Makowski was interested in helping us out. He is very knowledgeable about Board operations and was, in fact, an active member on at least one Board. He volunteered to not only help us with fundraising but

take a Board seat as Secretary.

- 3. Another member, Arleen Ravanelli, showed a lot of interest in promoting the White Shepherd Genetics Project as an organization to support for yearend donations and estate planning. Since Arleen was recommended by Joanne and constantly trying to learn more about the WSGP, she was appointed.
- 4. The book on *Starting and Building a Nonprofit* outlined requirements for a Board. The most important factor to consider was whether there was a passion for the project (translated to a love for the breed) and a willingness to govern by following the purpose for which it was organized.
- 5. Board officers legally govern the non-profit. They do not themselves do the day to day work of running the non-profit. I was advised that since I was doing daily work for the WSGP and also making application, I had to be a Board member, but since everything is decided by a majority vote, there should be no issue with me doing both.
- 6. What makes a good Board (taken from the Non-Profit book)? Members:
 - i. Share a passion for and commitment to the nonprofit's mission
 - ii. Are willing to roll up their sleeves when necessary to help with the practical work of the nonprofit
 - iii. Have strong ties to their communities
 - iv. Are diverse in age, gender, race, religion, occupation, skills, and background, and
 - v. Are willing to support efforts to raise money.
- 1. So what were the criteria for the rest of the members of the Board besides the obvious love for the breed?
- A variety of ages from early twenties to late sixties.
- A variety of geographic locations; not as diverse as it could be but taking into consideration that the Board is supposed to meet in person on a yearly basis, this group could manage that.
- All have demonstrated a willingness to work for the breed and most have already made significant contributions to the breed.
- Male and female.
- A willingness to work together for the breed with minimal personality conflict.
- 2. Who else was selected for the Board?*
- Besides the two members I already mentioned

(Ken Makowski and Arleen Ravanelli), former AWSA President, Maurice Seeger was asked and accepted. He had the ability to get the job done and maintain diplomacy as well as anyone could. Dale Malony, one of the major developers of our genetics website, writer of the interview article with Dr. George Padgett published in Hoflin, and someone who devoured information about the breed was another logical choice. Both of these men have good analytical minds that the project could use. Catherine Helfgott is the youngest member of the Board and most everyone in the United White Shepherd Club and AWSA are aware that she has jumped in with both feet and has become a great supporter of the breed. Dr. Mary Cardeccia has been our acting consultant concerning necropsy interpretations, diagnostic questions, and general information about diseases affecting our dogs and is a plus for our Board.

- 3. What about other qualified people?
- I think that a lot of people are qualified and I would hope that as people resign or their term expires that many others will take the opportunity to let their interest be known so that they can be nominated for a position on the Board.
- 4. Where does the Non-Profit stand as of this point in time?
- I was disappointed to learn that our paperwork was held up because of organization upheavals at the Foundation Group. This means that although the paperwork is complete, it still hasn't been filed. That should happen within the next few days.
- 5. How long before we might get approved?
- From what I understand, the earliest would be six months.
- 6. What happens in the meantime?
- If we are approved, then contributions people made and wish to deduct will be retroactive.
- 7. What is the Board doing at this time?
- The plan is for the Board to have their first official meeting sometime during the AWSA National and lay the ground rules and set the criteria for meetings via e-mail and/or conference calls.

Dock Diving


I believe that everyone who tried it or watched it loved it. What a fun thing to do with our dogs. You can see by the pictures that they had a blast.

I have been in the ring 4 or 5 times now over the years. Each time I am honored to be there and never expect any thing more than to have the chance to congratulate the winner, and stand among the

But as I stood in that ring I realized I was not looking for the win after all, we had beaten the odds

last year and this year I was surrounded by dogs that I tended to drool over myself at shows. I was in there with some of the best White Shepherds any where and it became just an honor to be in the ring with them. I started looking down the line wondering who would be this year's winner. I had my guesses and also my favorites, just as we all do - but it sure was not Lexi that was on my list.

As the judge made his

cut I started to get this silly grin on my face. I tried so hard not to want that win and stay calm, this is about the breed and those were my friends in that ring with me. But I could not wipe

Saturday! But it changed things that grin off my face, nor stop the

shaking that had started all over my body. Little did I know that grin would get MUCH bigger as the judge gave us the win, for the second year in a row. And what made it even more special was that my family was there this year for the first time to see it all. I still can hear my daughter's scream!

On a serious note - This year in Top Ten some thing happen I have never seen before, in any breed being judged. The judge gave 2 awards of excellence ribbons. I asked him about that when I saw him Sunday in the juniors ring and he told me that he wished he could have given 3. He was so taken with

> the dogs in the ring that he said: "It was just what Top Ten should be, a perfect example of what the breed standard calls for in each and every dog". We always

have one of the highest entries for Top Ten and also breeds showing at Premier. When a judge makes a comment like that it really speaks highly of our breed and their owner's commitment. Each of us should be very proud of that comment and all of our dogs.

Winning Top Ten is a wonderful experience, but what is more amazing is being at Premier in the ring with all those beautiful white dogs and their owners. It will be a few years before I get the

chance again to be in the Top Ten ring, if ever. But you can be sure that I will be at ring side each year to cheer - "GO WHITE DOGS"!!!



In 2002, my boy "Polo", Royal Von Tasz Classic, made history by winning "Best Top Ten Overall" at the UKC Premier. This annual event is an invitation only competition that pits the Top Ten Ranked Best of Breed winners of every qualified UKC breed against each other. The dogs compete at a breed level and then the winners of each breed advance to a group competition where another couple of dogs are selected to ultimately compete for "Best Overall". And, Polo captured that "Best Overall" honor under a 3 judge panel. This was truly an amazing accomplishment!

Since then, many great White Shepherds have captured Herding Group wins and placements at the UKC Premier weekend shows, which are separate from the Top Ten competition. My girl, Royal Spasz Von Tasz, "Pebbles" just happens to be one of those top placers. And, notably, she just happens to be a granddaughter of the infamous Polo!

Pebbles is no stranger to the show ring. She thrives upon it and it shows. As a puppy, she captured Best Puppy awards. She also captured a 5 point major, at just 6 months old, at one of the AWSA National Specialty weekend shows. She easily finished her UKC Grand, AWSA, and WSCC Champion titles.

Over the last few years, Pebbles has been a top ranked Best of Breed winner in multiple circuits which is pretty amazing since I only attend a few shows each year (they just happen to be "big ones" that are highly attended).

In 2006, Pebbles captured multiple Best of Breed wins, a Group 1st, and a Reserve BEST IN SHOW during the Premier weekend. What was particularly interesting about this win is that it was under a 3 judge panel and Pebbles and a Beagle were tied in points between the 3 judges for the BEST IN SHOW win. At the time, we (the Best In Show competitors) didn't know it and we were all wondering why it was taking so long for the judges to announce the winners. It wasn't until afterwards when I asked one of the UKC representatives what had happened that he indicated "there was a tie between the Beagle and the White Shepherd... They had to pull the rule book to see what to do!" As it turned out, the tie breaker, whatever it was, gave the win to the Beagle and Pebbles got the Reserve win. I still can't believe she came so close to taking it all back then! Later that year, Pebbles also captured the AWSA National Spe-



cialty Show Best of Breed win!


In 2007, Pebbles captured 3 of 4 Best of Breed wins during the Premier weekend. I believe she also placed in Group but the details escape me.... She was a top Best of Breed winner in multiple circuits but then we took some time off so that Pebbles could whelp a litter of 7 beautiful pups.

And now for the most notable win to date!!! This year, Pebbles captured 3 of 4 Best of Breed wins, a Group 2nd, a Group 4th, and a Group 1st that led her to a BEST IN SHOW win (without a tie breaker – LOL)! And, one of the first spectators to come over and congratulate us was the handler of the Beagle that had taken the win in 2006. ((smile)) I again want to extend a huge "thank-you!" to all of my wonderful friends who cheered us on and were there to share our joy.

I am so proud of what the UKC White Shepherd has done in less than a decade of the breed's existence. Thanks to everyone's efforts, we have established the White Shepherd as a breed that is here to stay and one of such superior quality that they can't be overlooked. I am so proud to own White Shepherds!

So, what are Pebbles and I going to do from here? Well, we're going to continue hitting the shows (when we can) and I'm also going to continue having a blast personally showing some of her kids from her first and second litters – Kole, Ramsey, and Ziva, just to name a few.

And, one day, I envision us all reading about another one of our many magnificent White Shepherds "taking it all" as the generations of excellence continues...



During the time of the Premier in 2007, I was anxiously awaiting the arrival of my first White Shepherd puppy at Dulles International Airport. I had heard some talk about the Premier online and in AWSA chat, and I thought about how exciting it would be to go. I made the decision to be there that following year.



The Premier this year certainly did not disappoint! I arrived in Kalamazoo and carcamped for the night (or rather the morning) in the parking lot with my dogs. That morning I woke up bright

and early to beautiful weather to get some breakfast for myself and my pups.

I was entered in all three conformation shows on Friday, Saturday Sunday and both of my dogs competed in these classes. The shows were not unlike other shows that I have attended, save for one or two differences. This was my first experience showing outside for one, and the sheer number of White

Shepherds showing was another. In each of the three shows there was no less than 24 dogs!

While I was sad to have missed the Top Ten Showing as well as the United White



Shepherd Club Nationals, I was able to gain a lot of experience from the All-Breed Shows. I gained a lot

of information from watching others show, and while some of it was a little overwhelming, it was most certainly informative! Everyone there was very helpful, and was able to offer me suggestions on what I can do to improve my abilities as a handler.

Perhaps the best part of the Premier in the Conformation Ring was Pebbles' win of Best in Show on Saturday. This was a first for the breed – to win a BIS at a UKC Premier All Breed Show, and while I wasn't able to see it (I was off purchasing food), I was able to return and celebrate the good news with everyone.

While Conformation was certainly the excuse to get me to Premier, I was really there for more than that. Getting an experience with UKC performance sports was one of those. I was amazed at the controlled chaos of the grounds. In one building there was Agility, in another Obedience, in a building in the back, Weight Pull, and outside there was Dog Sport,

Terrier Races, and Dock Diving (if there was more I forgot! There was just so much!). And all of this was within a five minute walk.

Being able to watch and experience these performance



sports helped give me a better idea of them. I am very interested in them, and it was an experience to be able to watch the UKC sports for a first time. Even more than that, there were chances to work with some of the sport groups to see if you were interested in those sports. I myself had some fun climbing into a pool with my dogs in a skirt to try dock diving. I learned that Leo is an inelegant swimmer but likes the water, and that Ruby is an awesome swimmer but just cant be bothered. I also took my dogs to work behind one of the stands with a helper from an SDA club in Illinois, which was good fun!

The shopping area was also a sight to behold. For someone like me...someone who likes to spend entirely too much money on my dogs...it was heaven. I was able to pick up new working equipment, new showing equipment, new treats, and yes — I didn't leave myself out - some shirts.





The best part of the Premier in my mind was the people. It was a good chance to meet people I had not yet met, as well as talk to those who have helped me grow as a Fancier in this breed over the last

year. I was able to debate some of my ideas (a must for

me), learn some new information, improve some of my skills, and see what it is I want to strive for in the future from my dogs. The Premier this year showed an opportunity for many White Shepherd Owners to show off their dogs in the many performance venues being held that weekend. White Shepherds participated in Dog Sport, Agility, Dock Diving, and others.





This year was my first year to go to Premier. I had wanted to go for a while, but couldn't really justify the drive. But, I have always told myself that if my dogs qualify for a National agility competition, I was going to do my best to take them to it. So, this year, when Kal-El was ranked 32nd and Sparrow was ranked 46th in the UKC in Agility 2, I decided to make the trip.

Over the four days of Premier, there were 4 agility trials and the All Star competition. Sparrow had a very good trial! On Thursday, there were two trials and she qualified in 3 out of the 4 runs I did with her. One of the qualifying legs was the final leg she needed to get her United Agility Champion Excellent (becoming the second white shepherd to earn this title...and the first bitch to get it!). Friday was the All Star competition, where she ran clean in Agility 2 and was the 5th place dog in her height division. Saturday and Sunday each had one trial and Sparrow qualified in all 6 of her runs, earning the first two legs toward her United Grand Agility Championship. She had multiple placements over the weekend.

Kal-El had a lot of fun during Premier, but was not as consistent as his sister. Kal is not quite as willing to slow down when I ask him to, and when you combine that with a serious case of cabin fever...it can make for some interesting runs! He did have a few nice runs, and ended up qualifying in 6 out of 13 runs. He placed several times also, when he got it together he really did well!

I did find that we were really busy with agility, the trials were full and ran late. It was sometimes hard to find time to go and watch some of the other events that went on. I did get to see some of the breed judging of the white shepherds and got to watch most of the Best in Shows. All around, it was a great experience and I'm glad that we were able to go.

ast year the Ultimate Air Dogs were set up for the first time at Premier. I had seen it on TV a couple of times and thought it was pretty cool. Well as you know it is a long time between shows and they said we could try the UAD jumping. The first time on the dock, Indy wasn't so sure about getting in - but the only toy he owned was in the water and without that toy he would be toyless. he jumped in head first and saved his toy. Everything went under water except the tip on his tail. What more could a dog ask - he was cool, wet, and he had his toy, and I told him he was great. From that point on he and I were hooked. We jumped every time we had the chance last year. At the end of the show we were awarded 5th in the novice division and couldn't have been happier.



When we got home, Scotty found out he had colon cancer and everything went on hold. But Indy still wanted to jump and run and do dog things. Nothing helps fight terror better then keeping your puppy happy. From June until the snow flew we found a practice dock and let Indy jump and play.

There is another group in this area called Dock Dogs and we went to some of their shows so that Indy could compete. He is so excited to jump I have to take the lead off before I go up the stairs since he pulls me off my feet going up. Of course the diving stops when the water freezes, but Indy still has his big red ball so the throwing did not stop and neither did the long walks. Scotty is now slowly

recovering from the cancer operation and the chemo, and will finally be able to travel next month. All due to the joy of a bouncy young dog that would not let him quit.

This year we were not going to come to the Premier, but Indy was invited to the top ten so how could we say no! Scotty still was unable to travel so Indy and I came alone. I sent an entry to UAD and was told the only slot they had was the Friday jump. Well one jump was better than none. When we got there we managed to squeak in two more jumps and lots of practice jumps.

Arleen was trying to get Lexi to jump and having to jump in with her, so we all went over to the practice pool. The idea was that if Indy lusted after Lexy's toy she might jump in so that Indy didn't get it. It was a good idea but Lexy was not fooled and Arleen had to continue to jump with her. After one jump Arleen twisted her ankle and had to stop. Because she could not jump her dogs she withdrew from the diving and gave Indy her spot.

With all the practice jumps we had, Indy was finally starting to jump up and out instead of just straight out. He was starting to gain distance. Indy's best distance was 11'8". This was a great improvement from last year

-8'6" and his first jump of 1'8". Now he was starting to reach. He jumped 14'8". To my utter amazement that won first in the junior division.


I know they will never forget that experience for the rest of their lives. Thank you!

The White Shepherd Dog is a breed we all cherish. It is a breed unlike any other, a breed with quirks, challenges, and, outweighing all else, joys. It is a breed that has faced hardship and endured without faltering, in part due to the unwavering dedication of its fanciers, and in part due to the breeds inherent nobility.

I think that we can all agree that this breed is certainly worthy of recognition in its own right. This breed has come a very long way because so many of you have held that belief near and dear to your hearts. And yet it cannot be denied that this breed still has a difficult road ahead; that the same, if not more, dedication will be required for what is yet to come.

While the breed seems to have come up against a barrier when it comes to AKC recognition, it does not mean that we shouldn't continue the fight for recognition in other venues. There has been some important work in to this affect in the performance arena such as the recognition of the White Shepherd as a breed by the Australian Shepherd Club of America (thanks to Becky's work). However, it is equally important that we fight for the same recognition within the other communities.

One such area of interest is the Health Community. Recently I was made aware that the OFA recognizes the White Shepherd Dog as a breed in its database. That is a step in the right direction – making use of this opportunity is the next. It is important that we show that we believe the White Shepherd Dog is a breed apart, not just in name only but in all aspects, to include health.

While the OFA recognizes our breed, there

are other health registries that do not. The two that come to mind are the Canine Eye Registration Foundation (CERF) and the (CHIC) databases. The CERF database lists designer breeds but not our own, which seems an injustice to me. If enough of us were to petition them, or submit their dogs as White Shepherd Dogs, we may be able to gain recognition from them.

CHIC is a database sponsored by the AKC Canine Health Foundation and the OFA Database. One of the CHICs philosophies is that each breed has different health concerns, and our own is no different. Having CHIC recognize our breed will lend a great deal of clout to our breed among the Fancy, because it cannot be denied that dogs with that coveted number are respected. This recognition can be obtained through one of the parent clubs.

The health community is a group that is very important to win over. If we gain recognition from this community it may lead to recognition with others, such as research and development. If the companies begin to recognize our breed as separate, that may lead to studies and the development of tests specific to our breed that will lead to better breeding decisions. If those communities do so, then it will lend some strength to our effort on other fronts.

This option is just one of many, and we must continue to research and look for other areas in which to show the Fancy and the AKC that this breed is a breed unto its own, a breed worthy of separation, recognition and respect.
