Meet The New Trial Members!

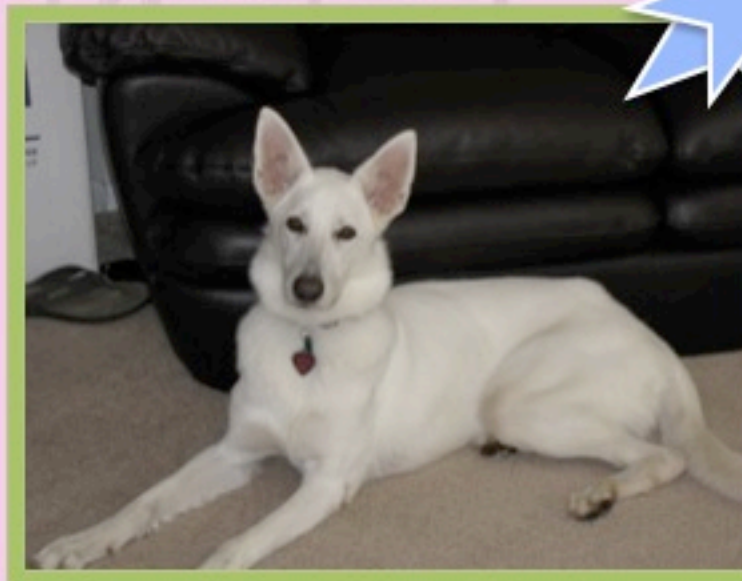

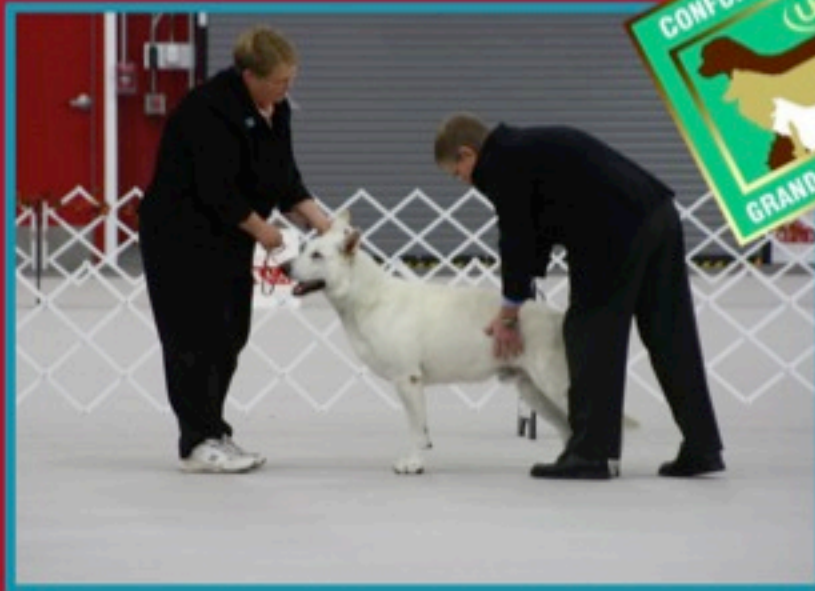

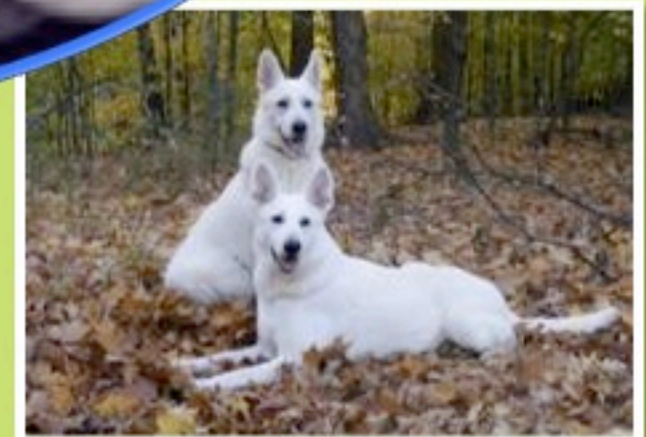

SPINAL RESEARCH

FOCUS: INTERVERTEBRAL DISC DISEASE

RESEARCHER: Dr. Leigh Anne Clark, PhD, Clemson, University

WANTED: Affected dogs and older "control" dogs with no symptoms.

- Dr. Clark needs to include all dogs that had back surgery and/or an MRI or CT scan because of accident, or ruptured disc, or protruding disc, compression, Lumbosacral Stenosis, etc. She will require a whole blood sample between 3 – 6 CC in a purple top tube for DNA isolation. She will require the OFA DM test. And, she will require copies of any of their reports related to the surgery. Anyone who has ever had a dog diagnosed for back conditions knows it is a very expensive proposition and many dogs who are in this position are euthanized without ever knowing what caused their symptoms. The WSGP and Dr. Clark need those still-living dogs that have had back surgery to be included in this research. This is how we'll learn if there is a gene for IVDD and whether most of our dogs can be expected to have disc degeneration problems as a result of normal aging and whether there is anything we can do to prevent injury in these long-backed dogs. We don't even know what we will rule-in or rule-out, but we now have a chance to find out for the good of the breed.

CONTROL DOGS would need to be very senior in age and definitely unrelated to any affecteds.

- From Dr. Clark: Preferably, no common grandparents for any dogs in the study. I realize this might be hard/impossible. We'll have to do the best we can.
- Since I haven't heard yet what Dr. Clark considers "very senior" in our breed, I can't give an age, but I can say that if you have a dog that is unrelated to any dog in our database that has been diagnosed with IVDD or any of the spinal problems, with NO symptoms of their own and they are what you would call "senior," then please contact me. We'll need the whole blood and the OFA DM test for these dogs, too.

If you as a breeder know of any of your puppy buyers who qualify but who are not club members, please make them aware and have them contact me at hustonjudy@gmail.com or call 517-546-3046. This is a huge opportunity folks, let's take advantage of it for our breed. Contact me with any questions. And, thanks to Dottie and Pete Piroha who donated their ad to the WSGP!

a story of a dog who stole my heart

Long Journey Home

I believe every dog lover gets a Heart dog that only comes once in a lifetime. I think such dog is a special gift from God. The Heart dog doesn't have to be a purebred or have any particular color or shape. He or she could be a mutt you rescued from a shelter, or a first puppy you raised. You will recognize your Heart dog because of a special bond between you and your dog. That bond goes deeper than a mere relationship of a pet and his owner. It goes beyond a working relationship of a dog and his master. Sometimes we call dogs like that our soul mates because they penetrate deep into our hearts and leave there an imprint of themselves. They become a part of us by unimaginable power of love. They grow to be able to read our minds just by looking at us, and we too can read theirs as if there was something inside of us that had an ability to translate the silent language of dogs.

My Heart dog came to me in the form and color of White Shepherd four months after I turned 40 years old. Maybe God wanted to wait until I am all grown up and mature so I can better appreciate His gift. He was right. I'm not sure I would appreciate such gift at a younger age. Back then my attention was divided to so many things that my life consisted of.

Perhaps she was sent by God to comfort me, mend my heartbreak after the loss of beautiful Gracie, my Flat Coated Retriever who died suddenly from cancer at a young age. My husband, Doug thinks that it is possible that Gracie's soul picked us the right puppy, or who knows maybe even entered another puppy's body to come back to us. Whatever it was it felt like our new puppy was destined for us from her very conception. To most people however the way she came to us would seem like a random chain of events.

There were only two girls in that litter and someone else was before me who reserved a girl. I was left with a puppy that was not my first choice. She was priced higher than her sister and she had more prey drive according to her temperament evaluation. I did not like the price and wasn't crazy about the high drive either. My mind kept going back in time to my first German Shepherd whose drive made me feel like I was working out every time I took her for a simple walk. She was a great working dog but she was exhausting. I also was afraid the pups might be aggressive. I asked her breeder to retest the pup using the working dog test. The breeder did and my leftover puppy seemingly scored well. Still I was uneasy about that prey drive and really did not know what to expect, as my puppy was more than 1,000 miles away from me and all I saw were 2 tiny pictures of her. I kept looking at those pictures trying to determine if this puppy would be a good companion to spend my next 10 -15 years with. I was trying to read her expression and imagine what she was thinking at that moment when someone took those pictures of her. The puppy that stared at me from the pictures looked serious and wise for her age. I liked the wise part and the fact that the puppy was staring right in my eyes, or in the eyes of the person who took the pictures. I think that soulful expression played the final role in my decision. It was as if she was calling to me without any awareness of my existence.

The day of her arrival had come! Doug and me nervously followed the airplane schedule since early morning. I had never received a puppy by shipping before and was anxious for everything to go well. The schedule showed that the connection airplane was arriving on time. We came to airport at around 3:30 afternoon and waited at the luggage office door. Finally we saw an airport attendant carrying out a crate. All that anticipation got so built up I was ready to burst.

I was trying to catch a glimpse of the white puppy inside the crate. The crate was set on the floor and it became clear to us that there was no white puppy inside of it. The puppy inside that crate was a black Lab.

My husband and I looked at each other and sighed. We went inside the office to find out when they were going to bring out another crate. We were told that there was no other crate...

Thus that long night of worries had began. Calling the breeder, the airports, trying to find out what could possibly happen to a puppy that was shipped from Kansas at 8 in the morning and got lost somewhere in transition. The Kansas airport people were telling us that they put the crate with the white pup on the plane to Chicago and Chicago airport people assured us they never received that crate with the puppy.

Now I must say that my husband by nature always imagines the worst possible scenario in any given situation. I think he inherited this ability from his mother. He is a very nice guy overall and I managed somehow deal with this quirky part of his personality. By experience I know that if I didn't get a chance to call him upon arrival from any of my long trips and confirm that I got there safely, by the time I get a hold of him he already planned through my funeral in his mind and suffers greatly. Needless to say that when our puppy was reported lost he imagined that some shady individuals stole her to make her bait for dog fights. He was nearly getting a heart attack picturing our innocent puppy being torn by angry Pit bulls...

Our marriage would never work if I did not have a totally opposite outlook and mental state of mind in crisis that are out of our control. I get quiet, pray and listen deep into my heart to what it tells me. Deep inside I knew she would be found. I just feared that physiological and psychological damage to a puppy after such prolong time of being locked in the crate could be detrimental. "Have little faith" – I was saying to my stressed out hubby in an attempt to comfort him.

At around 8 pm Chicago airport people called to report that they found a crate with our puppy in a luggage room pushed between large suitcases. The puppy did not whimper and that's why it was so hard to find her among rows of unclaimed luggage

That was 12 hours since she was shipped from Kansas. They ensured us they are putting her on the plane to Buffalo as soon as they can. We asked them to give water and food to the puppy.

We went home exhausted without the pup yet, but relieved that she is finally found and on the way home.

Back to airport at 12 in the morning. The airplane is landed and our puppy finally appeared in her crate. I could see white color of her coat shimmering through the air holes of her crate as the guy who carried her was approaching. She was moving and seemed okay! Thin and tiny but she was OKAY!

Here she was quietly staring at us through the crate and wagging her tail. Doug approached the crate first and with his gentle "Hi, puppy!" his long nose went between crate's door bars. His nose was immediately licked at all sides. The puppy was happy to feel human touch and hear people talking to her. I signed the paper and opened her crate. She looked like 16 hours long trip did not faze her a bit. She was clean and smelled wonderful just like young puppies smell when they still nurse from their mothers. She stepped right into my arms. I could feel her wiggling little furry body and wet generous kisses on my face. I scooped her up and snuggled her deep inside my coat closer to my heart to keep her warm. It was a cold winter night three weeks before Christmas...
